Passage: Psalm 119:89-96

## **READ & DIG.**    Read Psalm 119:89-96

God's Word is faithful, the Psalmist teaches us that in his love for the Lord's law and its insights. What an attitude to have when approaching God's Word! Let's take a closer look at what David is saying. Here's what jumped out to me.

### **FAITHFULNESS (vv.89-91)**

David begins this Psalm by praising the Lord for his word and his faithfulness. He is sure of the Word and describes it as "firmly fixed in the heavens." That's about as rock solid as rock solid can be. David is sure of the Lord and his rule over everything in the earth and he sees that everything is serving the Lord. In fact, he says in v90 that the Lord's faithfulness, "endures to all generations." What does he say about the earth? What does this teach us about God? How is everything a servant of the Lord?

### **DELIGHT (vv.92-93)**

If the law had not been David's delight, he would have eventually perished. We will see this theme repeated tomorrow as well. The law is set before David and us for our benefit. The law is beneficial for everyone. It's for the good of our friendships, school, sports, communities, churches and most importantly our walk with the Lord. It taught David and teaches us to how to live in a right relationship with each other and our Lord.

### **YOURS! (vv.94-96)**

What a way to begin the end of this section! David declares that he is the Lord's! He needs to be saved from his present circumstances. How relatable is that to our current situation. If you are a Christian, then you are the Lord's and can cry out to him to save you.

David knows that the wicked are out for him. That's not a surprise to him, but he continues to meditate on the law and consider the testimonies of the Lord. He is placing his hope in the Lord and his faithful word even in the uncertainty of what's next. What about you? Are you considering the Word during this time of COVID-19?

## **Apply & GO**

So, what now? What do we do with this? We know that the Lord's word is faithful and unwavering. It endures all things and will always be a constant. If you are a Christian, then you are the Lord's. Be encouraged by this. What will you do after hearing this truth? What can we learn about God? What can we learn about His Word? What does it mean to be one of his? (Rom. 14:7-9)
