Passage: Habakkuk 3:17-19

READ & DIG. Read Habakkuk 3:16-19

Today will be real short, but I want to give you an opportunity to write some things down. But quickly, let's see the end.

YOU RESPOND:

What does Hab expect to see in the coming days? What does v.17 say?

What does Hab expect to do when this happens? What does v.18 say?

Where will Hab ultimately find his joy? What does v.18 say?

Maybe ask and jot down some things you've learned for HAB.

Think through these questions as you do:

Can God be trusted?

Can joy really be present in the midst of the worst situations?

Can we really "get it" without really "getting it?" *Thinking of understanding.*

Will God actually go to any lengths to get the attention of His people?

I remember this quote from Refuel:

God is not always the God you want but He is always the God you need.

Honestly, I'm not always good with this...but that's my sinful heart/mind speaking.

Down deep I am thankful to have such an amazing, mind blowing God who I know is in full control.

Apply & GO

Where will you find your strength and joy today? In stuff? Situations? The weather? The Circumstances? My hope for us all is that we allow God to be our Rock, our Fortress, our Hiding place, our Joy, our Strength in times of trouble, doubt and confusion.

Turn your heart to Jesus today, find hope in Him.

At this point we see this, the old Hymn says it well.

*Turn your eyes upon Jesus, look full in in wonderful face
And the things of earth will grow strangely dim
In the light of his glory and grace.*
